

If you're planning a trip from Liverpool John Lennon Airport (LPL), you might have noticed something unsettling recently: the drop-off fees at the airport have changed twice in a short period. No loud headlines, no big announcements—just quiet hikes in the costs that add up quickly if you're driving someone to catch a flight.

The average UK drop-off charge recently stands at **£6.51**, but many airports are well above this. Liverpool John Lennon Airport is no exception, and its recent doubling of the drop-off fee has surprised many drivers.

Why Are Drop-Off Fees Increasing?

- **Airport revenue needs:** Increasing passenger numbers mean airports invest more in infrastructure.
- **Traffic management:** Higher drop-off fees disincentivize long kerbside stays to reduce congestion.
- **Inflation and operating costs:** General rises in costs also impact parking and drop-off prices.

Liverpool Drop Off Charge: What's Changed?

Until early 2024, Liverpool's drop-off charge was among the more reasonable UK airport rates. But since then, the fee nearly doubled in two separate increments, shaking up the cost for those dropping off passengers at the terminal.

Time Period Liverpool Drop Off Charge January 2024 £3.50 March 2024 £5.75 May 2024 (Current) £6.95

This final price is above the UK average of £6.51 mentioned earlier, making Liverpool one of the more expensive airports for drop-off charges.

What Should Travellers Check Before Going to Liverpool Airport?

Fees like these increasing without much notice [avoid airport drop off charge](#) means you need to keep a few handy checks in mind when planning your airport journey:

1. **Check the Official Airport Website for Published Prices:** Airports usually publish their latest parking and drop-off charges online. Confirm Liverpool Airport's up-to-date fees before you travel.
2. **Use Airport Parking Comparison Tools:** Websites like Holiday Extras airport parking comparison pages help you visualize the best prices for parking or long stay – often a cheaper alternative.

Free and Cheaper Alternatives at Liverpool Airport

Not everyone needs to use the kerbside drop-off lane. Liverpool Airport offers few options worth considering if you want to avoid steep fees.

- **Long Stay Parking with Shuttle:** This is typically cheaper than kerbside drop-offs. You park your car in a designated Long Stay lot and catch a transfer shuttle to the terminal. It requires some extra time (usually 10–20 minutes) but can save several pounds.
- **Park & Ride Services:** Although Liverpool's options are limited compared to larger airports, nearby park & ride facilities with shuttle services can be an economical alternative.
- **Public Transport & Taxi Drops:** Taking public transport or getting a taxi drop-off directly at the airport can circumvent parking charges entirely.

Weighing Time vs Convenience

Choosing free or low-cost drop-off points usually means accepting a shuttle bus ride or public transit time. For some, a kerbside drop-off with a fee is worth the saved minutes, especially with tight flight times or heavy luggage. Others prefer to pay less and start their trip a bit earlier.

To avoid surprises:
