## The Mechanics Behind the Scenes: Provably Fair Gaming

To fight suspicion and develop trust amongst users, trusted CSGO gambling sites carry out a system called **Provably Fair**.

This cryptographic technology allows gamers to separately validate that the outcome of every video game is truly random and has actually not been controlled by the home.

- **How it works:** Before a round starts, the server produces a secret "server seed" and hashes it, showing the hash to the gamer. The gamer's internet browser generates a "client seed." When integrated with a nonce (a counter), these three elements determine the game result.
- **Confirmation:** After the round concludes, the unhashed server seed is revealed. Gamers can plug these variables into a confirmation tool to prove your house didn't modify the outcome midway through.

## Dangers Associated with CSGO Gambling
