- **Case Opening:** Simulates the in-game case-opening mechanic, often with tailored chances and higher-tier skin swimming pools.
- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a single pot. The greater the value of a player's deposit, the greater their analytical possibility of winning the whole built up pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on professional CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) utilizing virtual balance or skins, predicting match winners, map scores, or specific in-game events.
