2. **Third-Party Trading Platforms**-- Sites such as Buff163, Skinport, and Dmarket often host listings with small discounts. Nevertheless, buyers need to validate the platform's credibility to avoid scams.
3. **In-Game Drops**-- For cases that still occasionally drop (e.g., Chroma 2), players can increase their chances by getting involved in main Valve operations or by using active servers. The drop rate stays low, so perseverance is vital.
4. **Event Giveaways**-- Occasionally, Valve or partner competitions host giveaways where gamers can win an unusual case. Keeping an eye on official announcements and social networks channels ensures opportunities are not missed out on.
