How to Acquire Rare Cases

Obtaining these products can be done through a number of channels:

- **In-Game Drops**-- Participate in the original operation or occasion where the case was available. Some cases still drop periodically throughout "replay" objectives, though the possibility stays tiny.
- **Marketplaces**-- Platforms such as the Steam Community Market, Buff.163, or third-party skin websites (e.g., CS2Stash) list rare cases. Always verify the seller's credibility and use escrow services.
