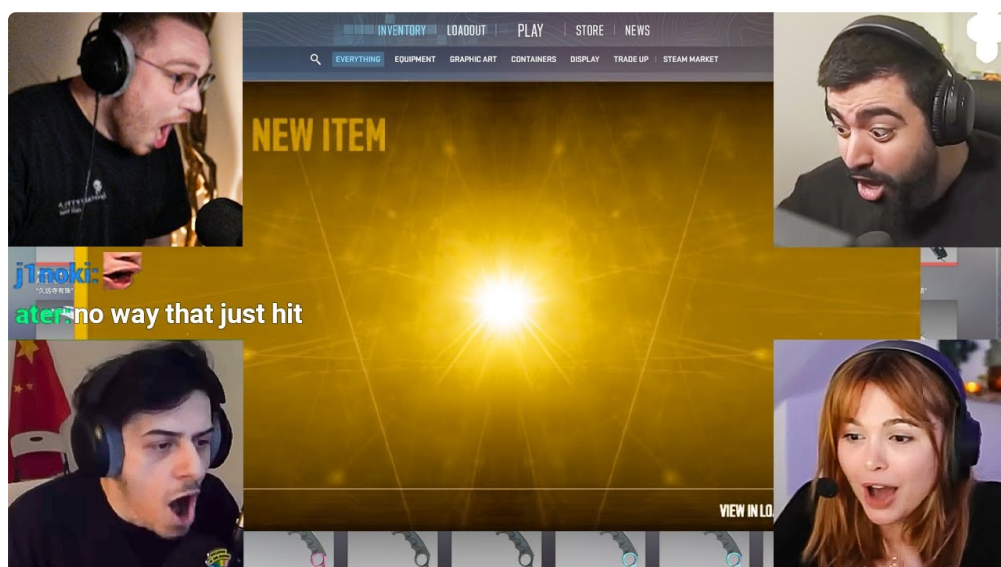
- **Classic Mode:** The gamer with the greatest total product worth wins everything.
