

What Is Included in Garage Door Repair Usually Include?

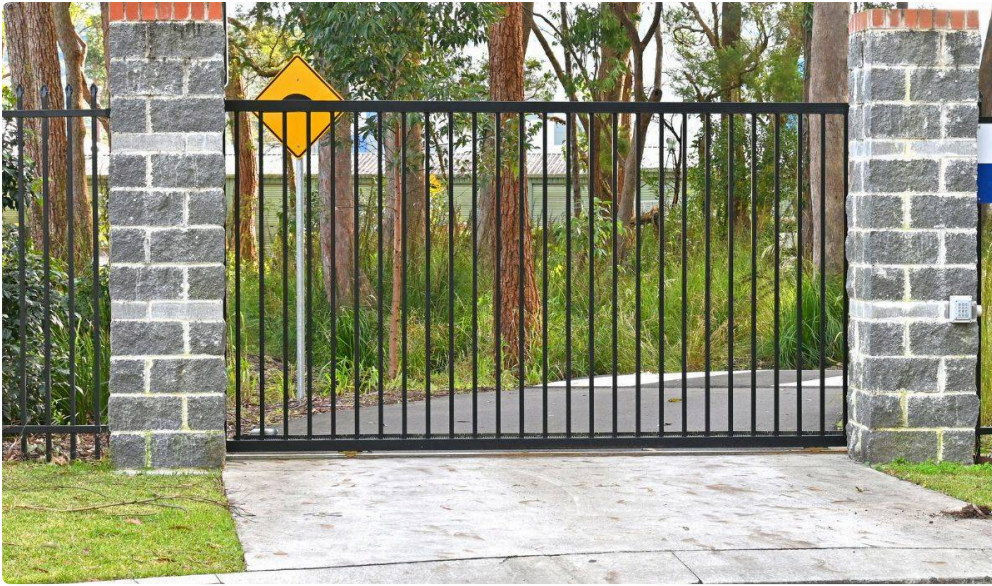
