Why Apartment Moves Require Careful Planning

Before moving day, you may need to coordinate with property management, reserve an elevator, arrange parking, follow specific moving hours, and protect common areas. At the same time, you need to pack your household belongings and prepare your new apartment.

Ask property management where the moving truck can park. If a permit is required, arrange it before moving day.

Also determine how far movers will need to carry belongings from the truck to the building entrance. A long carry can affect the time and labor required for the move.

Declutter Before Packing

One of the most effective ways to make an apartment move faster is to reduce the amount of property you need to transport.

Go through your belongings before packing and separate them into categories such as:

- Keep
- Donate
- Sell
- Recycle
- Dispose

Use Quality Packing Materials

Label Boxes Clearly
