The primary goal is basic: players place bets on which sector the wheel will stop on. However, the inclusion of a Top Slot multiplier in every round-- alongside 4 extremely various reward games-- elevates it far beyond a standard wheel-of-fortune game.

Understanding the Wheel Segments

The 52-segment wheel is divided into numbers and reward games. The numbers pay out even cash or much better, while the perk signs provide players entry into the game's headline acts.

Here is how the wheel is dispersed:

- **Number 1:** 21 segments (Pays 1:1)
- **Number 2:** 13 sections (Pays 2:1)
- **Number 5:** 7 segments (Pays 5:1)
- **Number 10:** 4 sectors (Pays 10:1)
- **Coin Flip:** 4 segments
- **Pachinko:** 2 sections
- **Money Hunt:** 2 sections
- **Crazy Time:** 1 sector

The Top Slot Feature

Before every spin of the main wheel, a two-reel mini fruit machine situated straight above the wheel spins simultaneously.

- **Reel 1** displays a bet area (either a number or a benefit game).
- **Reel 2** displays a multiplier (ranging from 2x approximately 50x).

If the bet area and the multiplier align horizontally, that multiplier is applied to the corresponding sector on the main wheel for that round. If the wheel arrives at that segment, all wins for that bet are multiplied accordingly, setting the phase for massive payments.

Dive Into the Four Bonus Rounds

The real magic-- and volatility-- of Crazy Time depends on its four interactive benefit rounds. These video games transport players out of the studio via CGI and provide the game's greatest win potential.

1. Coin Flip

The simplest of the bonus rounds, Coin Flip features a red-and-blue token flipped by a machine.

- **How it works:** Before the flip, both sides of the coin are assigned random multipliers.
- **The Outcome:** Whichever color lands deals with up awards the player the multiplier connected to that side.

2. Pachinko

Influenced by the traditional Japanese arcade game, Pachinko features a large physical wall filled with pegs.

- **How it works:** The host drops a puck from the top of the board. It bounces arbitrarily down through the pegs until it lands in one of a number of multiplier slots at the bottom.
- **The "Double" Feature:** If the puck lands in a "DOUBLE" slot, all multipliers at the bottom of the board double, and the puck is dropped again for a chance at even bigger rewards.

3. Money Hunt

Cash Hunt is an interactive shooting gallery video game presented on an enormous screen with 108 random multipliers concealed behind various symbols (like a cactus, a target, or a chef's hat).

- **How it works:** Players utilize an on-screen cannon to aim and shoot at a sign of their choice before the countdown timer expires. Once the timer ends, all players expose the multiplier concealed behind their picked target. (Note: In automated play, the video game picks a target for the gamer).

4. Crazy Time

The ultimate perk round and the hardest to trigger. The host opens a red door, leading players into a surreal, vibrantly colored virtual world featuring a massive, [crazy time free](#) 64-segment wheel.

- **How it works:** Players must select among three flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The host spins the wheel, and whichever multiplier the selected flapper indicates when the wheel stops is awarded to the gamer.
- **The "Double" and "Triple" sectors:** Just like Pachinko, if the wheel stops on a "DOUBLE" or "TRIPLE" section, all multipliers on the wheel boost accordingly, and the wheel is spun once again. This is where the maximum 20,000 x multiplier can be attained.

Pros and Cons of Playing Crazy Time

Like all gambling establishment games, Crazy Time features its own unique set of benefits and prospective disadvantages.

Pros:

- **Unmatched Entertainment Value:** High-energy hosts, bright visuals, and game-show styling make it extremely fun to enjoy and play.
- **Enormous Win Potential:** With the assistance of the Top Slot and reward round multipliers, wins can rise to 20,000 x the stake.
- **Interactive Elements:** Games like Cash Hunt and Crazy Time require (or simulate) player participation, adding a layer of engagement not discovered in conventional slots.

Cons:

- **High Volatility:** Because a large portion of the wheel's payout potential is connected to bonus rounds, dry spells can quickly drain a bankroll.
- **Lower RTP on Bonuses:** While standard number bets have a fairly good Return to Player, wagering exclusively on perk rounds normally brings a lower theoretical RTP.
- **Busy:** Rounds take place quickly, which can cause spending too much if gamers do not manage their bankrolls carefully.

Standard Strategies for Crazy Time

While Crazy Time is a game of pure possibility determined by a random number generator (RNG) and physical wheel physics, players typically use wagering methods to manage danger and extend their playtime.

- **The Cover-All Strategy:** Betting on all or the majority of the segments (numbers and bonus games) ensures you hardly ever miss a spin, though the expense of covering the board can surpass the smaller payments.
- **Reward Chasing:** Focusing exclusively on the perk rounds (Coin Flip, Pachinko, Cash Hunt, and Crazy Time). This is a high-risk, high-reward method because perk rounds occur on just 9 of the 52 sections.
- **Analytical Betting:** Relying on the game's history tracker. Some gamers like to bank on sectors that haven't hit in a long period of time (the "hot/cold" fallacy), though past spins statistically have no bearing on future outcomes.

Crazy Time has rightfully earned its track record as a pioneer in live dealer entertainment. By combining the classic beauty of a television video game show with modern-day digital graphics and massive payout potential, Evolution Gaming has produced an experience that attract both casual players and high-stakes gamblers alike.
