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When you reside in St George, you get sunshine, red rock dust, and difficult water. That mix is rough on flooring. Carpets trap the desert's fine grit, tile lines grab onto calcium haze, and grout darkens faster than you believe. Then there's agitation. When you hear a crew discuss a CRB (counter-rotating brush) or grooming rake, your ears ought to perk up. Agitation raises matted fibers and releases sand that vacuums can't touch. Rugs that feel "worn out" typically come back to life after a mild CRB pass before extraction. It's not glamorous, but it is among those little actions that separates quick work from comprehensive work.

## Dry times: four hours isn't a boast, it's a benchmark

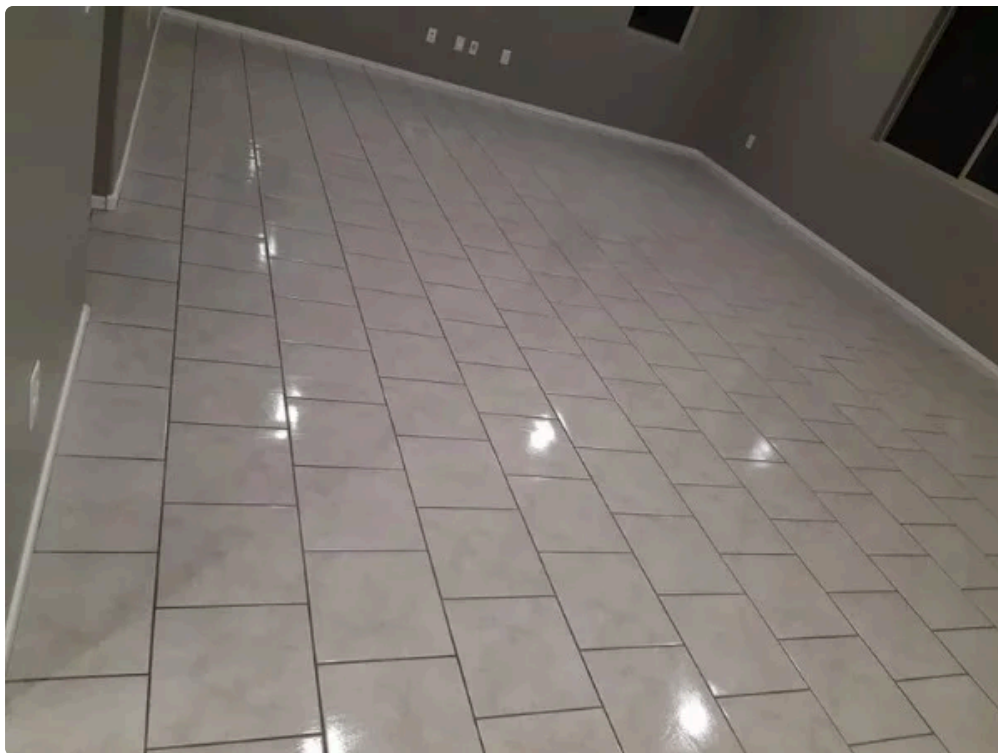
## **How often must you clean up in St George?**
