- **Prize:** Multiple players deposit skins into a common pot. A winner is drawn randomly, with higher-value deposits increasing a player's statistical opportunity of winning the entire pot.

Comparing CS2 Gambling vs. Traditional Online Casinos

While both involve wagering, CS2 gambling varies considerably from standard online gambling in regards to currency, accessibility, and community combination.
