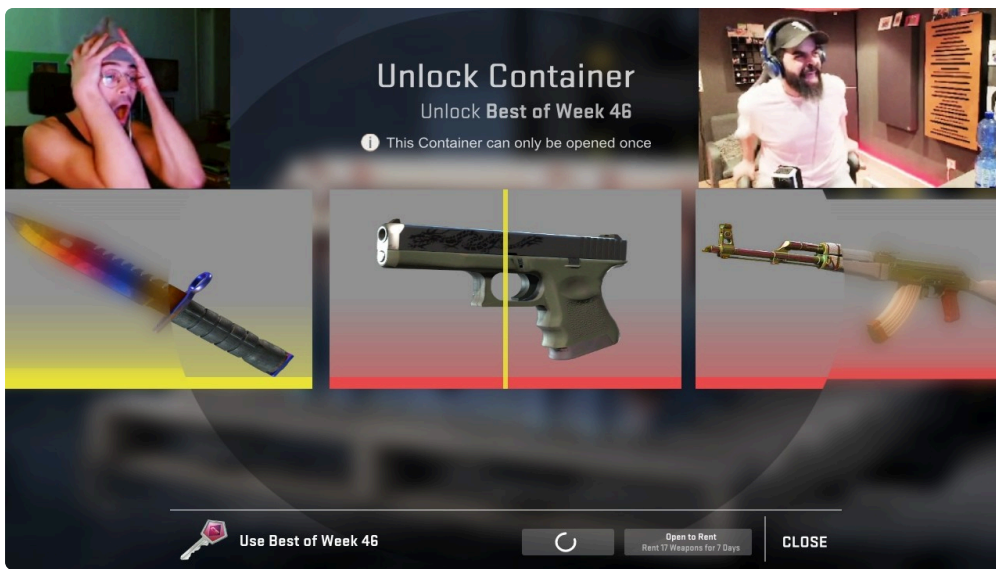
1. **Authorities Valve Store**-- The safest and most reputable source. Keys are offered at a fixed rate of £ 2.50 GBP (subject to regional taxes).
2. **Steam Community Market**-- Allows users to list keys for sale. Prices are market-driven and can be lower than Valve's cost, but validate seller reputation.
3. **Third-Party Marketplaces** (e.g., G2A, Kinguin, DMarket)-- Often offer discount rates, however transactions are outdoors Valve's TOS. Usage credible sellers to prevent rip-offs.
4. **In-Game Trading**-- Some gamers trade secrets straight for other skins. Always verify the trade through Steam's official trade window.

- **Consider Trading Instead of Opening**-- If you're after a specific skin, buying it straight from the marketplace can be less expensive than purchasing secrets and wishing for a fortunate drop.
- **Stay Informed About Market Trends**-- Prices for uncommon skins can skyrocket after a case is retired. Watching on market cycles can help you time purchases.
