

What Garage Door Problems Call for Professional Repair?

An overhead garage door is one of the most substantial moving systems in a Los Angeles home. It consists of heavy panels, springs, cables, rollers, hinges, tracks, and an automatic opener. If the door feels unusually heavy when disconnected from the opener, a spring or cable problem may be involved. A noisy garage door may have worn garage door rollers, loose garage door hinges, dry bearings, or a track that needs maintenance and adjustment.
